## Leave the aimless wanderings to Odysseus.

Chosen your route? Excellent. Now, it's time to get into your vehicle and switch on Porsche Communication Management (PCM): the central, high-performance control system for audio, communication and navigation functions.

Setting the language:

- 1. Press the **CAR** button
- 2. Press the **OPTION** button
- 3. Select "Set PCM system" 
  "Language PCM"
- 4. Select the desired language

To start the navigation system:

- Press the NAVI button.
- 2. Press the **STORED DESTINATIONS** button.
- Select the desired destination.

#### Weinheim-Rüsselsheim Route

#### **Route description:**

Enjoy the driving dynamics, acceleration and precision of your Porsche on stretches of motorway around Frankfurt. One of the special highlights along this 134-km route is the opportunity to drive a sports car through the Geo-Naturpark Bergstraße-Odenwald, a site that is protected and promoted by UNESCO. Other attractions

in the region include castles, palaces and the 'Felsenmeer' boulder field. Please note there is an increased risk of congestion during peak times.

## Leg 1

#### Frankfurt Airport-Bensheim

A very special experience at the wheel on predominantly flat stretches of motorway with only a few speed restrictions.

## Leg 2

#### Bensheim-Rüsselsheim

The journey continues on to the Rüsselsheimer Dreieck interchange with plenty of opportunity to discover the fascinating appeal of driving a Porsche on the motorway. Tip: if the Rüsselsheimer Dreieck interchange is congested, stay on the A67 and head to Frankfurt Airport on the A3.

### Leg 3

#### Rüsselsheim-Frankfurt Airport


All good things come to an end. Savour the last few miles in your Porsche on the return journey to Frankfurt Airport. At the end of your tour, simply hand over your Porsche at the First Class Terminal without worrying about refuelling.

#### Stop-off points:

- Alsbach services (on the A5 between Darmstadt and Bensheim) with views of Auerbach Castle
- Pfungstadt services (on the A67 between Gernsheim and Darmstadt)

#### **Places of interest:**

- Auerbach Castle (Schloss Auerbach)
   Ausserhalb 2, 64625 Bensheim-Auerbach
- Lorsch Abbey (UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site), Niebelungenstraße 35, 64653 Lorch

#### **Wetterau Route**

#### **Route description:**

A combination of fast sections of motorway and winding country roads for pure, unadulterated driving pleasure. The highlight of the route, which covers a total distance of approx. 161 km, is driving through the Wetterau region and the Upper Vogelsberg nature reserve.

### Leg 1

#### Frankfurt Airport-Gründau-Lieblos

Enjoy the exhilarating feeling of driving a Porsche on the first stretch of motorway that takes you to Lieblos.

## Leg 2

#### Gründau-Lieblos-Altenstadt

This meandering, slightly hilly section of the route provides the ideal conditions for exploring the unique driving dynamics of your Porsche.

## Leg 3

#### Altenstadt-Butzbach-Frankfurt Airport


Back on the motorway, there are only a few speed restrictions on the return journey to Frankfurt. A final opportunity to witness the powers of acceleration and precision of your Porsche on the motorway. At the end of the tour, simply hand over your Porsche at the First Class Terminal without worrying about refuelling.

#### **Stop-off points:**

- Parking and rest area at the exit for Gründau Lieblos
- Wetterau-West services (on the A5 just after the exit for Ober-Mörlen)

#### Places of interest:

- Natural spas and thermal baths, e.g. in Bad Vilbel, Rosbach vor der Höhe and Bad Nauheim
- Taunusblick services (on the A5 between the Bad Homburger Kreuz and Nordwestkreuz Frankfurt interchanges) with incredible views of the Frankfurt skyline

#### **Taunus Route**

#### **Route description:**

You'll find the numerous twists and turns as exhilarating as the feeling of driving a Porsche. Special highlights along the route, which covers a total of approx. 131 km, include impressive mountain scenery and thrilling winding roads.

## Leg **1**Frankfurt Airport–Wiesbaden

Set off along the motorway to Wiesbaden, before driving your Porsche along serpentine roads through the breathtaking Taunus hills.

## Leg 2

#### Wiesbaden-Eltville-Idstein

The hilly and meandering country roads en route to ldstein are perfect for exploring

the driving dynamics, acceleration and precision of your Porsche.

## Leg 3

#### Idstein-Frankfurt Airport


Savour the last few miles of this incredible Porsche driving experience on the return journey to Frankfurt Airport. At the end of your tour, simply hand over your Porsche at the First Class Terminal without worrying about refuelling.

#### Stop-off points:

- Numerous places to park up along the road between Eltville and Idstein (no signposted parking)
- Medenbach services (on the A3 after the exit for Niedernhausen)

#### Places of interest:


- Schloss Reinhartshausen winery and five-star Kempinski Hotel: Hauptstraße 41, 65346 Eltville-Erbach am Rhein
- Eberbach Abbey with its own winery and restaurant: Kloster Eberbach 1, 65346 Eltville am Rhein

#### **Route description:**

Drive your Porsche from the Taunus region right into the Rheingau. In addition to breathtaking views, plenty of enjoyment behind the wheel is also guaranteed. The highlight of this tour covering a total distance of approx. 133 km: an extraordinary driving experience along an impressive route, past vineyards and picturesque villages.

### Leg 1

#### Frankfurt Airport–Wiesbaden

Set off along the motorway to Wiesbaden, before driving your Porsche along the winding country roads and through breathtaking scenery.

## Leg 2

#### Wiesbaden-Oestrich-Winkel

The meandering and varied route is ideal for amply exploring the driving dynamics of your Porsche.

## Leg 3 Oestrich Winkel-Wiesbaden

Discover the superb handling and powers of acceleration on the challenging country roads through the hilly Rheingau region.

## Leg 4 Wiesbaden-Frankfurt Airport

Savour the last few miles in your Porsche on the return journey to Frankfurt Airport. At the end of your tour, simply hand over your Porsche at the First Class Terminal without worrying about refuelling.

### **Stop-off points:**

- Laukenmühle mill in the Wispertal valley (just before Lorch am Rhein with large car park and restaurant)
- Various non-signposted stopping points along the Rhine and in the Rheingau

#### **Places of interest:**

- Johannisberg Estate (Schloss Johannisberg), 65366 Geisenheim (winery and gourmet restaurant)
- Vollrads Castle, Schloss Vollrads 1, 65375 Oestrich-Winkel (winery and gourmet restaurant)
